MINUTES

Meeting called to order at approximately 7:00 p.m. by Supervisor Mark Englerth.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Supervisor Englerth spoke of Mr. Al McCrumb who recently passed away. Mr. McCrumb was the Township Supervisor from 2000-2012. Supervisor Englerth noted that Al Mc Crumb was near and dear to himself (Englerth) and the community. "In 1975, A. McCrumb was one of the first state police troopers at the Michigan post in Hastings. Through that time we had a lot of great relationships. I don't think too many of them ended up over the hood of his cruiser, but they could of. But anyway, not only was he a leader and a volunteer in the Michigan Police, which he was retired, he was a township supervisor for 12 years. I believe he was one of the individuals that was a volunteer and the backbone for building our fire station about 20 years ago in Yankee Springs... One of the stories that was told was that when he was a trooper, that there was a lady that had her home B & E'd and the door smashed in and he (McCrumb) was working second shift and when he got off of work, he went down to the lumber company and bought the materials and repaired her door, off duty, at his expense. So he will truly be missed. He's had a long struggle." At this time Supervisor Englerth requested a moment of silence out of respect for our former YS Supervisor.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT: Mark Englerth

<u>Veterans' Memorial</u> – M. Englerth noted that progress is being made but it is purely with volunteers. "We are going to run out of money before we run out of the project. And that was the business plan ... we chose to take," noted Englerth.

Boysen commented that Mark Englerth volunteered, along with Shane VandenBerg, to dig the hole, contract it to get all the concrete poured, set the stone, and backfill it.

VandenBerg commented, to Englerth, "I just want to say 'Thank you'. I want you guys to know, he (Englerth) is the guy that is behind the Veterans' Memorial. He is the one who is doing the bulk of the work. I, personally, did very, very little. I did the best I could do, but I want the community to know that this is the man (Englerth) that is pushing this and actually physically doing the work, going to the jail, getting inmates, bringing them to assist through this whole process. I just gotta say, 'Thank you'."

Englerth commented, "It's a lot more than me." Englerth thanked Larry Bennett, of Bennett's Tree Service out of Hastings, who brought in a crane to set the stone. Englerth noted that he would be putting together letters and having the board members sign them, to thank these individuals. "Terry McKinney of McKinney Poured Walls came in and poured the structural foundation, the outside of it... They didn't charge us any labor." Englerth commented that S. VandenBerg has brought in a backhoe and has done work. Englerth commented having a little bit of criticism and concern regarding having inmates working on the project. Englerth commented that being part of something positive and giving their respect and dignity back that "it is more than just the monument. It's doing something positive. And these people will admit that they've made a mistake. They will admit that they've fell down. And maybe its also part of our jobs to pick them back up..." Englerth commented that fundraisers will be coming up. "We've got a long ways to go, but we've come a long ways too," added Englerth. "We will be slowing down on money."

Englerth showed a sample of the ceramic tile that they are looking at to do the bricks. The tiles come 16" x 32" and are very durable.

Englerth commented on looking for volunteers from many trades to help, (concrete pouring, electric work, plumbing, etc.) and also financial help was encouraged, if a person is not able to volunteer. Englerth referred to Orangeville Township's memorial as his benchmark.

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Gypsy Moth- Englerth noted that Barry County Soil Conservation District is working with MSU and an assessment will be done in our township. Mark Bishop will be involved with the assessment. Hastings Point was noted as a hot spot. "We do not have a mechanism or a vehicle," commented Englerth. A meeting may be coming up regarding this matter.

Wind Turbines: Greg Moore, Public Liaison for Consumers Power, will be putting together a date for an informational meeting in the near future.

A Special Closed Session meeting is coming up with the township attorney upon request of one of the township board members.

<u>Dumpster for residential only – not commercial dumping</u>. Englerth noted the misuse of the township's "residential use only" dumpsters.

Wellhead Protection – M. Englerth commented that he spoke with Don DeVries of Fleis & VandenBrink regarding the water reliability study – which can be extended until 2020. Englerth referred to Brian Rice who was not available this evening. Regarding the Wellhead Protection grant, a decision has to be made by 6/15/18. Jansma noted that the grant was discussed at a previous meeting. Discussion took place primarily on whether this action is being mandated, or not.

Motion by Jansma with support from Lippert to accept \$2,875 matching grant for wellhead protection. Roll Call: Jansma: Yes, VandenBerg: No, Lippert: Yes, Englerth: No, Boysen: Yes. Yes: 3, No: 2. MOTION CARRIED.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Bill Medendorp, Vista Point, commented "At the June 2nd meeting, they said they were going to tell us who's planners. Did we make that decision on who is going to be elected in Planning? Or Appointed? It was said that at that meeting that it had to be on the 14th, because Mark promised that. I just wanted to know who is going to be in Planning and who is not. I just wanted to know because it is the 14th. So I would like to know did you all pick out the planners or didn't you? I would just like to know. And I'm going to say one more thing. I really appreciate the five (5) people on the board that are working together better. At first I was going to say some things, but now I changed my mind because I see a lot better attitude on the board. So, just tell me what you appointed for the Planning thing."

Mr. Rick Moore, Hastings, past Chairman and Vice Chairman of Charlton Park, noted that the Parks and Recreation Board has a grant program for local townships that can apply for their parks and rec. A. Jansma is aware of this grant and noted that the township has applied for a grant recently, and in past vears.

Cathy Strickland commented that she was asking for a friend, "Whose responsibility is it to put out buoys on Gun Lake and who owns the buoys?" Englerth commented that he would be happy to answer this question when it was not in Public Comment. The second question asked was, (C. Strickland noted that they were pleased that the buoy was out at the end of the Cuddy Drain, would it be okay to put reflective tape on it to see it in the evening to make it more visible? Englerth commented that he would get with C. Strickland on this.

Sandy Marcukaitis noted that she has been asked the question, "Why is the (Veterans') Memorial stone facing the fire station (parking lot)? It can't be seen from M-179, nor when you are going north on Payne Lake Road." Englerth commented that he would be happy to talk with S. Marcukaitis after the meeting.

Other Item: Discussion on Water Contract – (from Supervisor's Report)

Englerth commented on changes requested by and made for a YS Board member. Englerth would like to work on water contract in a workshop going through it slow and looking at the data, possibly bringing in Glen Leep. J. Lippert reviewed changes that were made to the contract in reference to the meeting of June 2.

Motion by VandenBerg with support from Englerth to table water contract with GLASWA until June 26th meeting. All ayes. MOTION CARRIED.
